*This is your book to keep. You will WRITE directly on the pages. Read each chapter.* 

**1.) At the beginning or at the end** of the chapter, make a bullet point list of the main events in the chapter. This is like a personal table of contents for your reference. You may also simply put a phrase at the top of each page, indicating the main event/ theme.

**2.) In the text,** as you read, you will underline or highlight passages that deal with the theme of LAW and LEADERSHIP. Include any that deal with "how" society works, or signs that society is NO LONGER working.

YOU MAY ALSO WANT TO NOTE IN THE MARGIN NEXT TO THE PASSAGE WHAT YOU THINK IS IMPORTANT ABOUT THAT PASSAGE.

- <u>First day of class</u> you will turn in your annotated book. That is a due date, with all the privileges and duties pertinent thereto. Your annotations will be graded — do not slack off!
- You will also take a reading quiz on the entire book when you return to class.
- First week of class you will be DISCUSSING and then writing a composition using the passages you have highlighted.
